Introduction

The Underground Mining Program is designed for individuals seeking an opportunity to enter the Mining Industry. This training is designed for individuals with limited work experience, who have a desire to work in the field. Students will gain the fundamental skills required by the industry to pursue entry level positions in the Mining Sector.

The program is delivered over four months, and classes run five days a week, 8:30am-4:30pm, Monday through Friday. The Underground Mining curriculum is comprised of both theory and in field practical applications. Students are required to complete all training modules offered in the program.

Applicants will need to meet the program prerequisites and complete a rigorous application process to demonstrate suitability for the programming. Please note: The program has limited seating due to the applied nature of the training.

- Orientation to Mining in Canada
- Mining on Vancouver Island
- BC Mines Act and Regulations
- Mining and Geology

Eligibility Criteria

You **may be eligible** for entry if you are:

- Unemployed and not on EI, and have not had an EI claim in the past three years
- Marginally employed, but do not have recognized post-secondary education towards a university degree or a recognized certification (such as a trades certificate)
- Physical aptness
- Have completed English 10 and Math 10 or equivalent
- At least 18 years of age
- Completion of a comprehensive application process
